Internet Acceptable Use Policy (Draft)

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Rationale

The aim of this Internet Acceptable Use Policy (AUP) is to ensure that pupils will benefit from the learning opportunities offered by the school's internet resources in a safe and effective manner.

Internet use and access is considered a school resource and privilege. If the school AUP is not adhered to this privilege may be withdrawn and appropriate sanctions will be imposed.

This policy should be read in conjunction with our Code of Behaviour including any addendums, Remote Learning Policy, Data Protection Policy, Child Safeguarding Statement, SPHE Policy, RSE Policy

When using the internet pupils, parents and staff are expected:

- To treat others with respect at all times.
- Not undertake any actions that may bring the school into disrepute.
- Respect the right to privacy of all other members of the school community.
- Respect copyright and acknowledge creators when using online content and resources.

This Acceptable Use Policy applies to pupils who have access to and are users of the internet in St. Tiernan's College .

- It also applies to members of staff, volunteers, parents, guardians and others who access the internet in St. Tiernan's College .

Misuse of the internet may result in disciplinary action, including verbal warnings, withdrawal of access privileges, detention and, in extreme cases, suspension or expulsion. The school also reserves the right to report any illegal activities to the appropriate authorities.

These sanctions will be in accordance with our Code of Behaviour.

St. Tiernan's College will deal with incidents that take place outside the school that impact on the wellbeing of pupils or staff under this policy and associated codes of behaviour and anti-bullying policies. In such cases St. Tiernan's College will, where known, inform parents/guardians of incidents of inappropriate online behaviour that take place out of school and impose the appropriate sanctions.

St. Tiernan's College implements the following strategies on promoting safer use of the internet :

- Pupils will be provided with education in the area of internet safety as part of our implementation of the SPHE and CSPE curriculum.
- Internet safety advice and support opportunities are provided to pupils in St. Tiernan's College through our Induction, Pastoral Care, ICT and guest speakers who provide students and staff with new developments in these areas.
- Teachers will be provided with continuing professional development opportunities in the area of internet safety.
- St. Tiernan's College will participate in Safer Internet Day activities to promote safer more effective use of the internet.

This policy and its implementation will be reviewed annually by the following stakeholders:

- Board of Management, teaching staff, and support staff.

The school will monitor the impact of the policy using:

- Logs of reported incidents.
- Monitoring logs of internet activity (including sites visited).
- Surveys and/or questionnaires of pupils.
- Surveys and/or questionnaires of pupils, parents/guardians and staff.

Should serious online safety incidents take place, Ms O' Malley should be informed immediately.

The implementation of this Internet Acceptable Use policy will be monitored by the Principal, Deputy Principal and ICT Co-ordinator, Ms. Mc Hale.

Content Filtering

St. Tiernan's College has chosen to implement the following level on content filtering on the Schools Broadband Network:

- Level 4 This level allows access to millions of websites including games and YouTube but blocks access to websites belonging to the personal websites category and websites such as Facebook, Instagram and Twitter belonging to the Social Networking category.

Pupils taking steps to by-pass the content filter by using proxy sites or other means may be subject to disciplinary action, including verbal warnings, referrals, withdrawal of access privileges, detention and, in extreme cases, suspension or expulsion.

Web Browsing and Downloading

Pupils will not intentionally visit internet sites that contain obscene, illegal, hateful or otherwise objectionable materials.

Pupils will report accidental accessing of inappropriate materials in the classroom to their teacher.

Pupils will report accidental accessing of inappropriate materials in school but outside the classroom to Ms. O' Malley.

Pupils and staff will not copy information from the internet without acknowledging the creator and referencing the source of the content.

Pupils and staff will be aware that any usage, including distributing or receiving information, school-related or personal, may be monitored for unusual activity, security and/or network management reasons.

Pupils will use the school's internet connection only for educational and career development activities.

Pupils will not engage in online activities such as uploading or downloading large files that result in heavy network traffic which impairs the service for other internet users.

Pupils will not download or view any material that is illegal, obscene, and defamatory or that is intended to annoy or intimidate another person.

- Use of file sharing and torrent sites is allowed with staff permission.
- Downloading by pupils of materials or images not relevant to their studies is not allowed.

Email and Messaging

- Students and staff are issued with a school (msletb) email, this email also comes with 5 free downloads of Microsoft Word to use on your devices.
- The use of personal email accounts is not allowed at St. Tiernan's College.
- Pupils should not under any circumstances share their email account login details with other pupils.
- Pupils should not use school email accounts to register for online services such as social networking services, apps, and games.
- Pupils will use approved class email accounts only under supervision by or permission from a teacher.
- Pupils should be aware that email communications are monitored.
- Staff should only use school email accounts while using school devices and when communicating with other staff and students.

Pupils will not send any material that is illegal, obscene, and defamatory or that is intended to annoy or intimidate another person.

Pupils should immediately report the receipt of any communication that makes them feel uncomfortable, is offensive, discriminatory, threatening or bullying in nature and must not respond to any such communication.

Pupils should avoid opening emails that appear suspicious. If in doubt, pupils should ask their teacher before opening emails from unknown senders.

Social Media

The following statements apply to the use of messaging, blogging and video streaming services in St. Tiernan's College :

- Use of instant messaging services and apps including Snapchat, Whats App, G Chat etc. is not allowed in St. Tiernan's College .
- Use of video streaming sites such as YouTube and Vimeo etc. is allowed at certain times in St. Tiernan's College .

Staff and pupils must not use social media and the internet in any way to harass, insult, abuse or defame pupils, their family members, staff, other members of the St. Tiernan's College community

Staff and pupils must not discuss personal information about pupils, staff and other members of the St. Tiernan's College community on social media.

Staff and pupils must not use school email addresses for setting up personal social media accounts or to communicate through such media.

Staff and pupils must not engage in activities involving social media which might bring St. Tiernan's College into disrepute.

Staff and pupils must not represent their personal views as being those of St. Tiernan's College on any social medium.

Personal Devices

Pupils using their own technology in school should follow the rules set out in this agreement, in the same way as if they were using school equipment.

The following statements apply to the use of internet-enabled devices such as phones , tablets, gaming devices, smart watches etc. in St. Tiernan's College :

- Currently pupils are only allowed to use personal internet-enabled devices during lessons with expressed permission from teaching staff. This is done when the teacher deems it necessary and for educational purposes within their subject area. The teacher will inform the Principal/Deputy Principal of the classes and period of time that this will be necessary as to avoid any out of class usage.
- Pupils are not allowed to use personal internet-enabled devices during social time.

Loan of devices for remote learning / to support teaching and learning

From time to time the school may loan a device(s) to student(s) for example during school closures advised by the DES/HSE requiring remote teaching and learning or when a need arises during the school year.

There is an msletb loan agreement form that must be completed and the policies relating to acceptable use of internet adhered to when using a school device .

Images & Video

Care should be taken when taking photographic or video images that pupils are appropriately dressed and are not participating in activities that might bring the individuals or the school into disrepute.

At St. Tiernan's College pupils must not take, use, share, publish or distribute images of others without their permission.

Taking photos or videos on school grounds or when participating in school activities is not allowed under any circumstances.

Written permission from parents or guardians will be obtained before photographs of pupils are published on the school website, facebook or twitter page. This is done as part of the enrolment process of St. Tiernan's College.

Pupils must not share images, videos or other content online with the intention to harm another member of the school community regardless of whether this happens in school or outside.

Sharing explicit images and in particular explicit images of pupils and/or minors is an unacceptable and absolutely prohibited behaviour, with serious consequences and sanctions for those involved. Sharing explicit images of other pupils automatically incurs suspension as a sanction

Cyberbullying

When using the internet pupils, parents and staff are expected to treat others with respect at all times.

Engaging in online activities with the intention to harm, harass, or embarrass another pupil or member of staff is an unacceptable and absolutely prohibited behaviour, with serious consequences and sanctions for those involved.

Measures are taken by St. Tiernan's College to ensure that staff and pupils are aware that bullying is defined as unwanted negative behaviour, verbal, psychological or physical, conducted by an individual or group against another person (or persons) and which is repeated over time. This definition includes cyber-bullying even when it happens outside the school or at night.

Isolated or once-off incidents of intentional negative behaviour, including a once-off offensive or hurtful text message or other private messaging, do not fall within the definition of bullying and will be dealt with, as appropriate, in accordance with the school's Code of Behaviour.

The prevention of cyber bullying is an integral part of the anti-bullying policy of our school.

School Websites

The website will be regularly checked to ensure that there is no content that compromises the safety, privacy, or reputation of students or staff.

The publication of student work will be coordinated by a teacher.

St. Tiernan's College will only use digital photographs, audio or video clips of students on the school website with the permission of parents/guardians as outlined in our enrolment forms.

Personal student information including home address and contact details will not be published on St. Tiernan's College web pages.

Permission Form

The school will provide information on the following legislation relating to use of the Internet which teachers, students and parents should familiarise themselves with: Data Protection (Amendment) Act 2003, Child Trafficking and Pornography Act 1998, Interception Act 1993, Video Recordings Act 1989, The Data Protection Act 1988-2018 , The Harassment, Harmful Communications and Related Offences Bill 2020(Cocos law).

I agree to follow the school's Acceptable Use Policy on the use of the Internet. I will use the Internet in a responsible way and obey all the rules explained to me by the school.
